NAROOMA CHOSEN TO HOST BIGGEST DAY ON SCAFL CALENDAR



The Narooma Lions have been selected to host the 2018 Sapphire Coast AFL (SCAFL) Grand Final, beating out interest from both Merimbula and Pambula.

The SCAFL's decision will not only bring in football fans from all over the South Coast, but could also lend a big hand in helping the Lions break a long premiership drought.

Narooma Lions president Harold Mackie said the club found out on Thursday, and is already in planning mode.

"It's only the second time we've held a grand final in my 20-odd years at the club, so it means a hell of a lot, especially with our push for improved facilities at the moment," he said. "There's a real buzz around the club. We've already started planning. There's a couple of conditions the league have put in place: we need adequate facilities for umpires, and we need a stage for presentations."

Mr Mackie said the club held interest in hosting the grand final before the season started.

"Right at the start of the year, even before we knew the position our senior team would be in, we expressed our interest," he said. "It was only two-or-three weeks ago that we had to kick off the official process."

Jarrold Moore, SCAFL's football operations coordinator, said there was a fair bit of interest in hosting the event.

"It's a pretty big day on the calendar, and we went with Narooma this year because of their game-day environment, and the way they've run their game-days throughout the year," he said.

"Based on how successful their finals have been over the past couple of years, we thought they were deserving of the grand final in 2018."

The Lions are the form team of the competition this year, but Moore said this had nothing to do with the decision.

"Last year they were the form side as well, and we went with Pambula," he said. "Form has nothing to do with it, we just feel the work and effort they've put in has shown they can hold a grand final.

"They've got all the facilities necessary to hold the event."

Moore said there may be some disgruntled clubs, but didn't expect any official complaints about the decision. "Every year we try and announced our decision as far out as possible to avoid any kind of controversy," he said. "There's always going to be a couple of clubs that may not be happy with here it's being held, but we just base it purely on who's best to host it that year."

Moore said he's looking forward to the biggest day on the SCAFL calendar, and encourage fans to get there early to make sure of a parking spot.

"Last year there were a couple of big upsets across the grades, and we all know anything can happen on grand final day," he said.

"All the grades are shaping up as being ultra competitive, so it should be a great day of footy."

And even though the Lions haven't sewn up a grand final berth, Mr Mackie can't help dreaming of a drought-breaking premiership at home.

"I've been with the club since 1994, and I haven't seen a senior premiership flag in all that time, so there will be a lot of emotion on the day if that happens," he said.

WHALERS SPARK BIG WIN

The Eden Whalers handed Tathra a surprise loss on the weekend.

However, the result was overshadowed by both clubs coming together to honour long-standing Bermagui Aussie rules player Marcus Shaw.

The Whalers donned Bermagui jumpers during their 17-13-115 to 8-8-56 win over the Eagles at Bermagui's Dickinson Oval on Saturday.



A Marcus Shaw commemorative seat was unveiled near the goal square in honour of the prolific goal-scorer for the Breakers.

A number of the Breakers club are representing Eden each week, so it was agreed at the start of the season to play a few games in Bermagui - and wear the Breakers' colours.

"It was a great way to honour Marcus' legacy at the Bermagui club," Jarrod Moore said.

"Eden and Tathra both got right behind it, and wearing the jumpers made the occasion a bit more meaningful," he said.

Eden stunned the Sea Eagles from the outset, bagging three first quarter goals, while the Tathra outfit could only land one to lead 20-9 at the first break.

Nathan Sebire and Brayden Grimmond were the standouts for the Whalers with some fantastic fast passages of play ensuring good forward motion for the Whalers.

The pair also featured on the scoreboard, kicking two goals apiece alongside Daniel Smith.

It was the second quarter where the Whalers truly locked down their first win of the season, keeping Tathra scoreless, while piling on six goals of their own to lead 61-9 at the main break.

Luke Grewar and Ben Thomas were the danger players with the boot, kicking four and three goals respectively.

Tathra clawed back a little, but a resplendant final quarter from the Whalers ensured the result was safely going Eden's way.

The men's victory capped off a pair of wins for the Whalers on the day as the women's team enjoyed a successful round against the Giants at Tuross.

The Whalers held a narrow lead early, but built to keep the Giants out of scoring position for the entire second half to win 8-8-56 to 3-3-21.

Maggie Brown, Catherine Marino and Kate Mitchell all kicked individual goals, while Kamilla Grubescic kicked five to ensure a clean victory.
