DIGGERS EN-TRENCH FOR FINALS RESULT OVER TATHRA

The Merimbula Diggers have booked tickets for the grand final after a rousing win over the Tathra Sea Eagles.



The Diggers showcased excellent control in high flying mark contests to secure a majority of possession on the way to a 12-10-82 to 4-2-26 win in the major semi-final at Berambool on Saturday.

Play opened at a fever pitch with both teams showing plenty of passion and aggression during the early ball contests.

With the stakes high, tempers flared occasionally and a player was even sent off for 10 following one altercation, but play finally settled into a rhythm.

The Diggers fired home the first goals with Daniel Worden starring in the opening quarter with three towering marks in the square to easily snap three through the big sticks.

Tathra's chances were harder to come by as forward movement was fairly well restricted by the minor premiers with Louis Coulton, Troy O'Loughlin and Scott Hay all well marked by their rivals.

Full forward Adam Blacka was also well guarded, limiting Tathra's options as the Sea Eagles could only muster a solitary goal in each quarter, while the Diggers extended their lead throughout.

Ethan White and John Simos were two of the best on ground for the home club as play focused largely around ball contests.

Meanwhile, Merimbula's big men showed their strength in the forwards to earn the result with Matt Molquentin and Dan Edwards also featuring heavily, kicking three and two goals respectively.

The Diggers will now enjoy a week off to rest as the club sits back to see who it will face in the grand final in two weeks time, as Tathra head up to Narooma to play Pambula for the final spot in the decider!

Breakers, Lions well positioned for grand-final assault after SCAFL semi-finals



The Narooma Lions' under 16s will play in the SCAFL grand final in a fortnight's time after a convincing 12.13 (85) to 3.0 (18) win over the Bermagui Breakers at Berrambool Oval.

The win gave the club something to cheer about on a day when both the under 12s and women failed to qualify for the grand final.

However it was a bumper day for the Bermagui Breakers, as they sent four teams directly to the grand final, including their under 14s and reserve-grade side.

The under 12s kicked off the day against the Bermagui Breakers, but the gulf in class between the two sides was apparent from the opening bounce.

Although Narooma's defence stood up in the first half, the forwards were kept scoreless until the fourth quarter in a 7.6 (48) to 1.1 (7) loss.

Aidan Hummel kicked Narooma's only goal of the day, while Bermagui's Flynn Kelly kicked a pair of goals.

Narooma will take on the Merimbula Diggers in next weekend's preliminary final at Bill Smyth Oval.

The under 16s were up next, and put together a professional display to breeze past Bermagui.

The Lions were on top from the get-go, kicking eight goals to three in a dominant first half to lead by 32 points.

They tightened the screws in the second half, keeping the Breakers scoreless while kicking four goals of their own to win by 67 points.

The women came into their match with the Bermagui Breakers as minor premiers, but were quickly out of the contest thanks to an extremely accurate Breakers outfit.

The second-placed Breakers were a perfect 6.0 (36) at half time, while Narooma limped to an 0.4 (4) scoreline.

Narooma showed some life in the third quarter through goals to Zhoe Hart and Rachael Kincaid, but Bermagui shut them out in the fourth to record a 10.3 (63) to 2.6 (18) win.

The loss leaves the Lions in a do-or-die preliminary final matchup with the Tathra Sea Eagles next weekend at Bill Smyth Oval.

Preliminary Final Preview

SENIOR'S – PAMBULA V TATHRA

Two of the most evenly matched sides in the competition will go head to head on Saturday in what promising to be an exciting match. Both sides finished Season 2019 with 8 win and 4 losses and will be looking to take the final spot in the Grand Final. Tathra will be disappointed in their performance last week after getting jumped early by the Diggers, and will look to stop Pambula doing the same this weekend. The Panthers are coming off a week-end off having beaten Narooma in gale force winds a fortnight earlier, and will be hoping the week off will help them get over the line. This match will be won in the midfield with both teams boasting quality midfielders who will be looking to get on top early. Look for this to be a very physical game and one of the games of the day.

Pambula Player to Watch: Tom Ferguson, *The mobile Pambula forward has been building form after an injury interrupted season, and at his best is one of the most damaging players in the comp. Can play as a tall or small and will certainly give Tathra coaches a headache trying to find the best match up for him.*

Tathra Player to Watch: Luke Taylor, *The Sea Eagles veteran has reinvented himself as a fullback in 2019, and has won his fair share of battles against some of the competitions best full forwards. Had the Better of the Panthers leading Goal Kicker last time they met and will be looking to do the same again to help the Sea Eagles to a Grand Final berth. Prediction: Pambula by 15 Points.*

WOMEN'S – NAROOMA V TATHRA

The Lions were blown away last weekend against a well drilled Bermagui side and this weekend poses as a danger game for the Lions looking to regroup both mentally and physically. Both sides will come into this game knowing they are in for a tough fight. Tathra will need to curb the impact of the Lions strong midfield, with players like Zalie Betts, Talia Moreton-Stewart looking more dangerous as the Year has gone on. While the Sea Eagles will be looking to the likes of Tyjana Blacka, Gabriella Tarlington and Sarah McMahon to lead the side to a win.

Narooma Player to Watch: Zalie Betts, *The Lions barometer, If Zalie is playing well then Narooma plays well, she will need to be at her best this weekend to get help her side in the grand final.*

Tathra Player to Watch: Darby Hayes, *One of the youngest Sea eagles, Hayes has been a consistent performer all year and that shows with her being one of Tathra's leading goal kickers throughout 2019. One of the future stars of the women's competition. Prediction: Tathra by 4 Points.*

MEN'S RESERVES – BROULEE/MORUYA V MERIMBULA

After finishing the home and away season as minor premiers, Broulee/Moruya were jumped by a fast starting Bermagui outfit in the 2nd Semi-Final, resulting in a disappointing loss for the GIANTS. They will be out for redemption against a Merimbula side who have showed plenty throughout 2019 and will need to be at the top of their game to be a chance of knocking over the GIANTS

Broulee/Moruya Player to Watch: Buster Ware, *League Leading Goalkicker, will be a handful for the Diggers defence to control.*

Merimbula Player to Watch: Damon Kerr *A young gun who has plenty of speed and uses the ball well, will be important in around the footy. Prediction: Broulee/Moruya by 23 Points.*

UNDER 16'S – BERMAGUI V MERIMBULA

The Diggers take on the Breakers with plenty at stake for both sides. Bermagui have the upper hand having not lost to the diggers all year. The defenders will have their hands full with Ryan Holdsworth and Clancy Ballard who have been lively up forward for the Breakers. Bermagui were able to control the footy at times last weekend against a strong Narooma outfit and will be looking to do the same this weekend. This match has the potential to be one of the matches of the day.

Bermagui Player to Watch: Ryan Holdsworth, *Has been looking dangerous up forward in recent weeks and will hopefully have his kicking boots on the lead the Breakers to a win.*

Merimbula Player to Watch: Blade Raeck, *Has been a consistent performer for the Diggers all year, will be looking to have a big impact come Saturday. Prediction: Bermagui by 11 Points.*

UNDER 14'S – BROULEE/MORUYA V PAMBULA

It's a North v South battle this weekend with the Giants up against the Panthers. The Giants were able to put the pieces together last weekend against minor premiers Bermagui, but ultimately fell 2 points short. They will be looking to put in another inspired performance this weekend. On the other hand the Panthers had a convincing win against Merimbula in their minor semi final and will be confident that they have the side to push the Giants right to the end.. League Leading Goal kicker Will Kellar will be keen to make an impact from the first bounce this weekend and Broulee/Moruya will need someone to play a role to curb his influence on the match. Broulee/Moruya looked very damaging last weekend and will be looking to key players like Tasman Simons and Morris Absolon to continue their form into the weekend.

Broulee/Moruya Player to Watch: Elijah Turner-Collins, *takes the game on and creates excitement whenever he gets the footy, provides the Giants useful run out of the backline and will be looking to use his speed on Saturday.*

Pambula Player to Watch: Jai Van Camp, *Inside midfielder who uses his body well and is damaging around stoppages. Will be hard for Broulee/Moruya to stop. Prediction: Broulee/Moruya by 14 Points.*

UNDER 12'S – NAROOMA V MERIMBULA

Merimbula were able to get the win over their fierce rivals, the Panthers, in the Minor Semi Finals, While the Lions took on the Breakers in a match that saw the Breakers progress to the grand final. Merimbula will want to play a lot better than they did a fortnight ago if they are to be any chance of beating Narooma this weekend. Narooma played a solid second half last weekend before and will look to bring that form into this match up. Coach Greg Tiffen will be hoping his young side turns up in the first quarter this weekend instead of the second half, as getting a jump on the Diggers is key in gaining momentum for the rest of the game.

Narooma Player to Watch: William Tiffen, *Has been fantastic all season and will be hoping to continue that form. Leads from the front and brings the best out of his team.*

Bermagui Player to Watch: Harry Blewitt, *Was influential in the Minor Semi and is a vital part of the Diggers midfield. Look for him to have a big impact on this match. Prediction: Narooma by 7 Points.*
